Greetings BCC School Family, I trust everyone had a restful and enjoyable break, and are prepared to tackle the last quarter of the 2018-19 school year. Finish strong as I like to say! Historically the month of April is a fast-moving month in schools as spring break occupies the first week and families tend to get busier with community activities. As noted in the last couple of newsletters, state and end of the year assessments occupy a fair amount of school-time in April and May. These assessments are used as measures of student growth and school performance. Please be aware of test schedules (dates and times) and help prepare your children, as appropriate. Finally, there is value in having pre- and post-test conversations with your children. In education, we like to say that a positive attitude matters. Students who think they are capable of accomplishing tasks and performing well on assessments are often more successful. These students often have a growth mindset. Students with growth mindsets believe that they can grow their own intelligence through work and effort. They tend to accept and like challenges and are willing to exert the time and effort to perform to the best of their abilities. Your consideration and support is appreciated, as the performance on state assessments are a significant measure of a schools rating.

A couple critical reminders:

There are specific testing dates for grades 3-7 and 11 the next few weeks. It is essential that students are prepared and on time for school.

- April 11-12 M-STEP grade 11 Sci and Soc Stu
- April 15-19 M-STEP grade 5 ELA, Math, Sci and Soc Stu, 8th grade Sci and Soc Stu, 5th and 8th MI-ACCESS, Make-up testing M-STEP grade 11
- April 22-28 SAT & ACT Make-up testing grade 11, M-STEP Make-up testing grade 5th, 8th, and 11th all subjects
- April 29- May 1 M-STEP Testing ELA and Math grades 3rd,4th,6th and 7th, and MI Access Testing Grade grade 6th and 7th, M\_STEP
- May 6-10 M-STEP MI-Access Make-up testing grade 3rd,4th,6th and 7th

School Values

Our School's mission emphasizes academics, personal connections and positive character traits. While our school's mission represents BCCS's unique trademarks, the character traits are shared values intended to guide our actions within the school community. Whether it be your child, another student, a staff member, or a fellow parent/guardian, let us look for opportunities to recognize and affirm these traits in action.

The April BCCS character traits highlight FAIRNESS and COURAGE. Fairness means impartial and just treatment or behavior without favoritism or discrimination. I think this may be harder for people to do than what we might think especially young people when being fair may not be popular among certain peer groups and/or in certain situations. The act of fairness combines honesty with equity, and often a little courage is needed. Courage is a person's ability to do the right thing when they know it is not going to be easy. Most of us view courage in the physical sense like bravery in battle. However, there are other types of courage that play a huge role in schools including social courage, intellectual courage and moral courage.

From a student's viewpoint, I think fairness is often having the courage to do what is right.....not always the easiest road for sure! At any rate, as members of BCCS , we are called to look for and recognize acts of fairness and courage in the school community.

### Important Communications

**School Performance:** The Annual Education Report (AER) will be posted to the website by weeks end. This report is required by the Federal and State Laws and includes key information about the school, teacher certification and student performance for the 2017-18 school year. A printed copy will also be available in the school office.

### **School Safety and Welfare of Students**

**MI Programs:** Reminder of two school safety initiatives offered through the State of Michigan: OK2Say and Protect MI Child. Both programs are designed for families with school-age students. If you have not seen these it is worth your consideration as a member of the BCCS school community.....

- **OK2Say:** a program designed to empower Michigan students, parents, school personnel, community mental health service programs, and law enforcement to share and respond to student safety threats. <http://www.michigan.gov/ok2say/>
- **Protect Mi Child:** a tool designed to block adult-themed content from reaching your child's electronic device (phone, tablet, computer/ personal accounts). Just register your child's cell phone number, email address, etc... to help prevent ads for alcohol, tobacco, online gambling and even pornography from reaching your child. <https://www.protectmichild.com/>

**Dress for Success:** Please assure students have the proper attire for school. I ask that parents review the school dress code on page 23 of the student handbook with their children
