Principal's Update



Hello Members of the BCCS School Family, school is well underway and in full swing at this time. Make no mistake, your continued efforts to support education in your home is critical to the success of your students. I ask that you make school a priority and pay close attention to the school's expectations and how your children are performing. You may have heard of Capturing Kids Hearts, a program designed by Flip Flippen, a personal friend of mine. Flip would frequently say " *Feedback is the breakfast of champions*". As parents and teachers we are reminded to stay connected with the students and take full advantage of the upcoming parent teacher conferences.

School Values



In the school's mission, there is emphasis given to personal connections, academic excellence and positive character traits. The character traits focused on during the month of October are responsibility and self-discipline.

You may have heard of the GRR (Gradual Release of Responsibility) Model of Instruction. This is an instructional model that usually follows a pattern of instruction: teacher models or demonstrates the lesson, then the teacher guides the students' practice, then the teacher uses strategies where students collaborate and work with one another, and finally, the teacher sets-up opportunities for independent practice by students to demonstrate their learning. Taking responsibility for one's own learning is huge and necessary for students to be career and college ready.

Self-Discipline is the ability to control and motivate yourself to do the right thing. It plays a major role in setting and achieving goals. This includes self-correction, which is my personal hope for all of us. Self-discipline brings stability and structure into a person's life and helps to strengthen a person's sense of control.

Character traits are observed through a person's actions or behavior. Like most behavior, responsibility and self-discipline are learned through direct instruction, guided practice, collaboration and independent practice. As BCCS members, let's look for opportunities to teach, raise awareness and recognize acts of responsibility and self-discipline in the school community.

Attendance.... Strive for Five: Step 1 of the Strive for Five program includes ongoing reporting of students who are considered to have chronic absenteeism (missed 10% or more of daily attendance) to the Office of School Participation and Truancy through Kent ISD. The parents/guardians

will receive a letter from the ISD that generally requires them (and age appropriate students) to hold an Attendance Improvement Plan Meeting with school personnel. The primary purpose is to review the conditions surrounding the absences, and to develop and submit an attendance improvement plan. We want to make families aware of this process as we anticipate initial letters will start being sent to specified BCCS families in the next couple weeks. Check out the PSA

School Safety



Morning Traffic Flow: In order to improve the traffic flow in the morning, we need your help. Please consider the following guidance:

Use a parking spot and the crosswalk if....

- your children are not ready to exit.
 - students need extra time to exit the vehicle (having a lot of materials/large instruments/projects etc... to bring in the building).
 - students have to get things out of trunk or backend of vehicle after exiting.
 - parents want to come in the building.
 - the drop-lane is backed-up close to Burlingame .
- The drop-lane runs along the sidewalk, and should only be used exclusively for dropping-off students.
 - The middle lanes are for exit travel or travel to parking spaces, not to drop-off students

Please be patient, careful and mindful of your surroundings. Your attention and response is very much appreciated.
