- Monitor and have dialogue with children about their academic activities and performance
- Communicate with school staff when needed
- Seek opportunities to be an active member in BCC school related events and activities.

School Character Values

The BCCS Mission emphasizes academics, personal connections and positive character values. These are the pillars of our school's culture and intended to connect us, and separate us from other schools. The character traits are core values intended to guide our interactions between members within the school community. Our school celebrates and recognizes these values each month. Whether it be your child, another student, a staff member, or a fellow parent/guardian, let's all look for opportunities to recognize and affirm these traits in action.

During the month of September, the school highlights Cooperation and Teamwork....important character traits in pretty much all areas of the school. As a member of our school community, you frequently hear staff ask for your cooperation, support and/or help. Teamwork and cooperation go hand in hand as they both move people toward a common outcome. In our case, it is student learning and development. Additionally, a person's ability to successfully work in a team is one of the most highly sought-after qualities by employers. For good reason, as a school community, we are called to grow student capacity and recognize and celebrate cooperation and teamwork in action.

Monthly Character Trait Video Contest:; Each month BCCS students will have an opportunity to create short videos to demonstrate our monthly character traits in action. Students can create a family video, a class video, a video with friends or any combination thereof. Each month designated staff members will select a video to share with the entire school at the Golden Eagle Assembly. For those who'd like to begin planning, next month our positive character traits are Responsibility and Self Discipline. Your consideration is appreciated.

Criteria to win:

- -Videos must be 90 seconds or less in length
- -All entries are due by the 20th of the month prior to the assembly
- -Winner will be chosen by a rotating committee of staff
- -To determine the winners, the committee will be looking for the following criteria in your videos:
 - Clearly highlights **one OR both** character traits of the month
 - Creativity/Originality (for example: drama, dance, song, etc... think outside the box)
 - School Appropriate (no violence, drug references, foul language)
 - Impactful/Memorable- sends a clear message that demonstrates the designated character trait(s)

Important Communications from the Office

School Annual Parent Signature Pages: All families are asked to have their annual and one-time signature pages turned in by next Friday, September 9. We can accept one page per family for the handbooks and concussion. Concussion Awareness and Acceptable Use Policy Acknowledgement (starts in grade 5) signature pages are one time forms: for those who completed in prior years are good to go! All other forms will need to be completed and returned each year.

Student Drop-off and Pick-up: Many thanks to the BCCS families as the student drop and pick-up driveline have been going well. One point of clarification, parents are to drop-off all BCCS students at one time regardless of where you are stopped in the line-up.

Reminders: Breakfast starts at 7:35. Otherwise the normal drop-off times are between 7:40 and 7:55.

Student Start of Year Assessments

<u>NWEA/MAP Tests:</u> Students in grades K-8 will have MAP testing in the areas of Reading and Math. Grades 4 and 7 will also take the science tests. These tests are required to be administered in the first 30 days of school. MAP tests, considered Benchmark Assessments, are given 3 xs per year to measure student performance and growth, identify students for supplemental services and provide teachers guidance on individual strengths and weaknesses.

<u>F and P Testing:</u> All K-3 students and designated students in grades 4 and 5 will be administered the Fountas and Pinnell Reading Assessment. F and P tests help measure student reading levels, identify students for additional services and monitor student's literacy growth.

Entrance and Exit Doors: With the exception of the start and end of the day, all building entrance/exit doors will remain locked during the school day. When parents/visitors enter, they are to enter the front door and will need to have office personnel electronically unlock the door. Unknown guests may be required to state their business and show credentials. With few exceptions, visitors must sign in-out, report to the office and receive a pass if entering the building.

School Happenings

Technology Update:

Mid High students were issued chromebooks this week. A couple reminders

- All students received in-house orientation and training with regard to school expectations, proper use, caring for device, and liability
- Students are responsible for the device while in their care
- Devices are to be used EXCLUSIVELY for educational activity communicated by BCCS
- Device Insurance is available

Daily Preparation:

- Students are expected to bring fully charged devices to school each day
- Students are expected to use carry cases when traveling to and from school

No Put Down Zone/ Poster Contest: Our school is declared to be a No Put Down Zone. All members of the BCCS School Community, visitors and guests are expected to refrain from putting someone else down while at the school or any school related activities. Mr. Kasmer is holding the 4th (and final) annual No Put Down Zone poster contest. Students in grades K-5 and 6-12 will have an opportunity to submit one poster to Mr. Kasmer by Monday, September 19. The poster board will be available in a designated location. Please place the student's **name** and **grade** on the back of the poster.
