Dear Parents and Guardians of BCCS Students,

Warm greetings to BCCS Families! October generally represents a time when as parents/guardians and educators we are called to emphasize the student's responsibilities, and provide guidance to students for their understanding of how to meet the expectations of school. Let's make a point to question students about their awareness and understanding of their role as a student, then monitor and regularly provide feedback about their school-related activity and performance.

BCCS provides multiple ways to help parents in understanding how their children are performing in school:

- parents of student in grades 3-12 can log into PowerSchool to view student's grades, if you need help with this please contact Mrs. Boersma at kboersma@byroncentercharter.org
- next Wednesday each mid-high student will receive an individual progress report
- parent/teacher conferences are held for all students on Thursday, October 12
- Parents of students in grades K-9 will receive their student's latest M-STEP and NWEA test scores

All parents/guardians are encouraged to take advantage of the academic information provided by the school, and, most importantly, have conversations with your kids and their teachers regarding their performance in meeting the educational expectations of school.

## **Building Character Traits**

One of the three pillars in our school's mission is *Building Positive Character Traits*. The character traits during the month of October focus on *Responsibility and Self-discipline*.

Responsibility is a common word used in the educational setting...parents and teachers are frequently heard reminding students to be responsible or accept the responsibility for something. Self-discipline refers to the ability to do what is asked of them and/or overcome their weaknesses or personal feelings and do the right thing. An example in a school setting relates to a student's ability to have the self-discipline to prepare for tests while giving a *good faith effort* during test administration. Providing opportunities in building positive character traits among our students is part of our purpose at BCCS. Let's look for, and recognize, responsibility and self-discipline in action with BCCS students, and let's identify the positive impact that comes from applying these traits in the school community.

# From the Office

<u>Parent Teacher Conferences:</u> Fall conferences will be held in person on Thursday October 12th from 12:30-8:00 pm. Registration will begin next week.

- The school will send a google doc to all families on Wednesday, October 4th
- Parents *with multiple students and parents of students with special needs* will have the first opportunity to register Wed Friday (Oct 4-6).
- Registration *will open to all students' parents* after school on Friday (10/6) through Tuesday (10/10).
- All conferences are to be scheduled prior to 7:30 am on Wednesday, October 12.

### Please Note:

The conference registration google doc will include a link for each teacher with available times. Parents select the time, then write their name and their child's name in the description box. Directions will be included.

Two common errors include

- Parents who register for conferences using their phones, yet their phones have the wrong time zone setting. Remedy: Check the time zone setting prior to registration and ensure the time is correct when you receive a confirmation email.
- Following the sequence of steps when having to change conference time Remedy: cancel the existing conference first, then register for a second conference.

<u>Student Test Score Reports</u>: The latest student test scores (parent reports) will be shared at Parent Teacher Conferences to include 2022-23 Spring M-STEP and MME Reports (grades 4-9 and 12) and the 2022-23 Fall MAP Reports (Grades K-8).

- NWEA MAP Growth Reports will display trend data: a student's current and all past performance for MAP Growth Assessments administered at BCCS.

Children in  $1^{st}$ ,  $3^{rd}$ ,  $5^{th}$ ,  $7^{th}$  and  $9^{th}$  grades will have their vision screened

<u>Fall Allergies:</u> Fall and spring are the seasons of allergies. In the fall there are primarily 3 culprits: Molds, in particular piles of damp leaver are perfect breeding ground for breeding of mold spores.

Dust Mites, in particular dust mites grow in heating and cooling ducks during summer and are released into the air when first turning on the heat in the home.

And Ragweed....the biggest trigger of all! We have plenty of it...The months of September and October have the highest amounts of Ragweed pollen in the air

Allergy symptoms can make a person feel lousy and are annoying ... .itchy, watery eyes, stuffy nose, sneezing & coughing ,scratchy throat and sometimes causes breathing issues especially for

asthmatics. Of course, speaking to a primary care physician is recommended, yet there are overthe-counter allergy medications suitable for children that may be administered to reduce the impact and

symptoms. A pharmacist can assist in selecting the proper meds for the age of the child.

<u>Post Graduate Resource Requirement</u>: MCL 380.193 requires ISDs. LEAs and PSAs to share Post-Graduation resources with students in grade 8-12 by October 1. The Michigan Department of Labor and Economic Development has developed a web page specifically designed for this purpose. Contents include college information, financial aid, career and job specific information and current trends, and information about joining the armed forces and/or public safety sector.
