After School Mid-High Academic Support Reminder

Mid-High Extended Day Supplemental Support: BCCS offers designated students the opportunity to have extended day/after school supplemental support services in grades 6 through 12 on Tuesdays and Thursdays. As customary, beginning with Fall Parent Teacher Conferences, teachers began the identification and communication with students(and parents) who would likely benefit from additional support, primarily targeted for English Language Arts and Mathematics courses. Please know this is a grant-driven program for qualifying At-Risk students. Invitations and enrollment for participation will be made on an individual basis, and parents are encouraged to take advantage of the extra support offered to their children.

In closingHalloween presents an opportunity for students to have fun and build relational capacity in their communities. Schools are asked to share a few reminders about basic safety tips for children who participate in Trick-or-Treating including traveling in a group, wearing bright colors or reflective tape, avoid costumes that are trip hazards for children, and avoid traveling in vehicle traffic lanes if at all possible. And, as always, look both ways to ensure it is safe before crossing any street. Unfortunately we also know there are sometimes bad actors who tamper with treats given to children.
