However, please note the website to access is HERE for all school performance indicators to the public to include annual performance ratings, individual school performance data along with the ability to compare to other schools (encouraged). Finally, the department has resources for public access and understanding to include *The Michigan School Index Guide*, and *School Preview and Access Instructions* that can be found at this LINK.

From The Office

Attendance

As parents/guardians and students of BCCS, the expectations and protocols for attendance should be understood and followed. All schools are obligated to carry-out the school BOE Policies and comply with the regulations of the State of Michigan. Parents/guardians and particularly HS students are highly encouraged to reacquaint themselves with these school's expectations of student attendance, specifically the impact absences can have of obtaining course credits for graduation.

Please understand the reason for the continued emphasis on attendance from this office is the impact

absences and tardies have on individual students, their peers and teachers, and the fact that BCCS has a history of above average disruptions in daily attendance. Finally, should any parent need assistance with their children, please request through the school office.

HS Attendance and Course Credit Eligibility

By BCCS School Policy, any HS student who has more than 10 absences in a semester will not be issued credit for the course. Tardies are also impactful as every 3 tardies equates to an additional absence in that class.

Our school believes attendance should not be the sole reason students do not receive credit; therefore, BCCS offers students an opportunity to make-up time for absences.

Students may attend the extended day program Tuesdays and Thursdays to make up hours for absences. A student may receive 1 hr of time for each day he/she attends the extended day program. All dates attended during that semester can be used toward make-up time. Please be reminded each day attended equates to one hour make-up time in one class; therefore, if a student has 11 absences in 6 classes, then 6 hours of make-up time are required to be eligible for credit in all six all courses. It is the student's and parent's responsibility to monitor and track attendance, and request to stay after school as make-up time for credit. Parents and students should monitor attendance and request for make-up time when needed. The first semester ends on January 19. All make-up must be realized by then so as not to impact eligibility for credit.

News You Can Use

<u>Nurses Corner:</u> As the holiday season approaches so does increasing concern of flu and other respiratory illnesses such as COVID, RSV (respiratory syncytial virus) and others. Early symptoms of each can look similar for many children, including congestion, cough, runny nose, muscle aches, fever, and headache. Since each virus typically begins as an upper respiratory infection, it can be difficult to know which one you are dealing with when your child gets sick. The only way to determine which virus is causing an infection is by getting tested by a physician if symptoms persist.

If your child is sick and/or has medication(s) that they need to take during the school day, here is a review of our school policies:

- Medications can only be administered after a medication permission form has been filled out.
 This includes ALL over the counter medication (examples: Tylenol, Advil, Aleve, Benadryl, triple antibiotic ointment, even cough drops)
- 2. As required by state law, schools <u>are not</u> able to provide any over-the-counter medications. These must be provided by the parent or guardian.
- 3. Any medications sent MUST BE IN ORIGINAL CONTAINER and properly labeled with the student's name. Parents must deliver the medication to the office.
- 4. During any illness, student(s) may return to school ONLY after they are fever free for 24 hours without the aid of fever reducing medications. (Fever is defined as a temperature of 100 degrees or above without the use of fever-reducing medications.)
