Season's Greetings to the Parents and Guardians of BCCS K-12 Students,

Last week BCCS announced that the annual School Index ratings were yet to be released to the public. On December 4th, the 2022-23 School Index Reports for all Michigan Public Schools were released for public viewing. The 2022-23 Report shows a slight drop in our school's overall performance rating from 86.60 To 84.24. The primary reason for this was lower student performance (both proficiency and growth rates) on state testing this past school year. The School Support designation is Universal Support, indicating that BCCS is not, and has never been, an identified school for improvement at any level by the department. While BCCS has some challenges, our school continues to perform above average.
