Dear Parents / Guardians of BCCS K-12 Students,

On behalf of all BCCS Faculty and Staff, Happy New Year! I hope that all of you took full advantage of and truly enjoyed the holiday season over the past 2 weeks. WOW ...2023....it also is hard to believe we are within 3 weeks of the end of the first semester for the 2022-23 school year. At this time the school has received their annual accreditation status and MDE ratings for the past year. BCCS parents and the general public can obtain school performance information and compare schools through the information provided on the School Accountability web page. Specifically, the two primary performance rating systems for Michigan Public Schools are School Index. Once again, our 'Small But Mighty' school has demonstrated above average performance when compared to state, county and like school cohorts. In fact, we were recognized as a REWARD SCHOOL (see school grades), indicating we received an "A" rating in student performance as compared to schools and with our graduation rates for the 2022-23 school year. This is the second time we received this designation in the past 5 years...not by happenstance folks, Good Job, Well Done to all members of the BCCS Education Community.

Character Traits in Action

This month we are celebrating the values of *Care and Compassion*. Each week we will encourage students to look for ways to care for others and help people in need. In the spirit or 'walking the talk', examples of schoolwide activity include the annual Hat and Mitten tree where by students and staff donated 44 winter items to In The Image, the BCCS annual Food Drive during November where student and staff donate 1,305 lbs. of food to the Buist Community Center food pantry, and we are to hold the second of the 22-23 school year and much needed Blood Drive in February. Annual Education Report: Upon the anticipated Board of Education approval on January 17, BCCS will post the 2021-22 Annual Education Report (AER) to the school's website. The AER provides a series of informational items regarding the school's performance including student assessment, state accountability and teacher quality. Please be reminded that due to the pandemic, there is limited data from the 2019-20 school year (IE no state assessment data). The report meets the state and federal statutory requirements and is intended for the awareness and understanding of the members of our school community and the general public.

Benchmark Testing: Over the next month all K-8 students will be administered the NWEA MAP (Measure of Academic Progress) growth assessments. Growth reports will be shared with parents during spring parent/teacher conferences. Additionally all K-3 students and students receiving Title I services in grades 4 and 5 will be administered individual Fountas and Pinnell (F&P) tests to monitor reading growth and program effectiveness.
