## **News From the Office**

<u>Literacy Grant Update:</u> Additional one-time grant money has been offered to Michigan schools for a variety of purposes. Our school applied for several grants and the awards are now being realized. At this time we share information about a recent grant award we received that focuses on learning loss.

• Additional Services: The funding is being used for additional services in literacy development for designated K-5 students. In particular, experts in early literacy have identified two areas heavily impacted by disrupted education caused by the pandemic: Explicit instruction in Phonics and Phonemic Awareness for Early Learners. Therefore, under the direction of Kent ISD Literacy Specialists, we selected a program to help students bridge the gap in loss of learning in these areas. We hired and trained two part time service providers, (Miss Elise Berner and Mrs. Kathy Hoyle), who now meet with identified students 5 days per week during the school day.

• Family Literacy Night: The grant also afforded our school opportunity to provide a Family Literacy Night to K-3 students receiving Title Ia Reading support services. Invitations were sent home with the students' report cards last week and we hope to see all guests on February 16.

<u>Thank You GVSU:</u> The Charter School' (CSO) Office of GVSU is providing financial support for multiple student field experiences this year. This month the BCCS 8th grade students will attend a program about "Amending the Constitution' at the GR Ford Museum on February 7. The CSO is financing the entrance and transportation fees and providing lunch for our learners. Look for the announcement of additional student educational programs supported by GVSU in April.
