With the exception of WIDA the administration of state assessments begins in April and runs through mid-May. Initial awareness and preparation information will begin to come home in the next few weeks, yet the most valuable actions in the home are awareness and preparation to include:

- Be aware of test dates and what tests will be administered for your children
- Encourage your children to give a good faith effort
- Engage your children in conversation about the tests
- Assure your children get proper rest and a nutritious breakfast

Incidentally, our school received a financial reward from GVSU Charter School's Office and we were recognized by the State of Michigan as a REWARD School as a result of our performance on state assessments last year. Lets keep going folks....
