School Protocol Reminders

School Entrance :

- All K-3 Students should enter the building using the North Doors
- All K-5 Students who are dropped-off before 7:45 will gather in the gym
- Students eating breakfast should be dropped-off between 7:35 and 7:45, breakfasts are expected to be consumed prior to the 8:00 start time.
- Parents who park and drop off students are asked to remind their children to use the crosswalk and follow the guidance of the parking lot attendant when crossing.
 Reminder...ALL students are to use the crosswalk during DRIVELINE at the end of the day.

Technology Reminders (primarily Mid-High):

- a. School issued technology use is exclusively for school/academic purposes only.
- b. Personal devices (laptops, tablets, I-Pads etc <u>are prohibited at school</u>. Cell phones are discouraged during school and school related events and activities . K-8 Students may not have cell phones on their person from the time they enter to the time they leave to include school day activities and events. HS students may use phones before and after school, during lunch and passing time.
- c. Tech Bags are to be used exclusively for school issue technology, not to transport personal belongings or school related materials.
- d. Mid-High students are not to use BlueTooth earbuds during class. Students may have their own headsets/earbuds for school, and the school approved headset graphic can be found <u>HERE</u> for your understanding. *Preserving academic learning time.*
