Federal School Meals Program Applications Needed

If you have not already done so, we ask every BCCS family to complete the application for school meals. In a recent publication the State of Michigan sent-out a reminder of the value of these applications in the determination of several state and federal grants and student support services (see <u>It's More Than the Form</u>) to all schools. As noted, this is especially the case for Charter Schools as there are no district boundaries. Please take a few minutes and complete the application. Student Drop-off and Pick-up: Many thanks to the BCCS families as the student drop and pick-up driveline have been going well.

- GSRP (Preschool) begins Monday with additional cars and foot traffic. Preschool parents must
 park and walk students to and from class, with designated parking in the south west section of
 the lot.
 - Schedule: M-Th 7:45 to 2:45

Entrance and Exit Doors: With the exception of the start and end of the day, all building entrance/exit doors will remain locked during the school day. Parents/visitors enter the front doors and office personnel electronically unlock the door for entry. Unknown guests may be required to state their business and show credentials. With few exceptions, visitors must sign in-out, report to the office and receive a pass if entering the building. *The safety and welfare of students and staff is priority one.*

School Happenings

Student Start of Year Assessments

<u>NWEA/MAP Tests</u>: Students in grades K-8 will have MAP testing in the areas of Reading and Math. Grades 4 and 7 will also take the science tests. These tests are required to be administered in the first 30 days of school. MAP tests, considered Benchmark Assessments, are given 3 xs per year to measure student performance and growth, identify students for supplemental services and provide teachers guidance on individual strengths and weaknesses.

<u>F and P Testing:</u> All K-3 students and designated students in grades 4 and 5 will be administered the Fountas and Pinnell Reading Assessment. F and P tests help measure student reading levels, identify students for additional services and monitor student's literacy growth.

School Issued Technology:

- All students received in-house orientation and training with regard to school expectations, proper use and liability
- Students are responsible for the device while in their care
- Devices are to be used EXCLUSIVELY for educational activity communicated by BCCS
- Device Insurance is available until Sept. 15 (see Technology Insurance)

Daily Tech Preparation:

- 6-12 Students are expected to bring fully charged devices to school each day
- 6-9 Students are expected to use carry cases when traveling to and from school and cases are to be used for school issued technology ONLY.

Cell Phones:

- K-8 :-prohibited on their person from the time entering school to the time exiting the school are prohibited. Includes most school related events during school.
- 9-12: may have use before/after school, during lunch and passing times.

Headsets: Bluetooth headsets should not be on their person in grades K-8 while at/in school and are prohibited in the 9-12 classrooms. BCCS Headphone Graphic HERE

Nurses Corner

Welcome back to a new school year! It's so exciting to see all of our returning students and new students who have joined us. Schools are required to ensure students have proper immunization on file. If your student(s) still needs required vaccines, there was a letter in your open house folder. It is important to set up an appointment with your child's physician or local health department to get vaccine(s) completed <u>as soon as possible</u>. Reminder letters will be sent out to you in the next week. If you didn't (and don't) receive a letter or phone call from me, your child is all set! Thank you so much for your promptness.

In keeping in line with other school's protocols this year, and keeping students in the classroom, our policy has changed a bit to treat COVID diagnosis similar to flu/influenza.

- If a student tests positive for COVID <u>and</u> has a fever or more moderate to severe symptoms, please keep them home until fever free for at least 24 hours <u>without the use of Tylenol or</u> <u>Motrin</u>.
- If a student(s) tests positive for COVID but has mild to no symptoms (similar to cold/allergies), they can still go to school as usual. Masks are optional.

CDC recommendations remain the same as COVID numbers continue to rise, especially with return to school. Day 0 being the day someone tests positive, isolating at home for 5 days, and then returning to normal activities if fever free for at least 24 hours without Tylenol or Motrin. <u>GSRP Openings Still Available:</u> There are a handful of openings for GSRP (preschool) run through Kent ISD and Located on the BCCS campus (in the portable) for the 2023-24 school year. Kent ISD GSRP is a state funded program designed to benefit four-year-old children in our communities. GSRP is guided by Developmentally Appropriate Practices (DAP) through individualized instruction for all children. Each classroom utilizes intentional teaching practices designed to meet the needs of all children and families by using child data to provide purposeful instruction.

The Kent County Preschool Intake can be found (<u>at this link</u>). It provides a step by step process to determine if your child is eligible to attend a FREE preschool program in Kent County--Great Start Readiness Program or Head Start. <u>https://preschool.kentisd.org/</u>

<u>MI School Safety Programs:</u> Reminder of two school safety initiatives offered through the State of Michigan: OK2Say and Protect *MI* Child.
