Dear Parents/Guardians of BCCS K-12 Students,

Happy February BCCS...

With just two weeks into the second half of the year, we are reminded that historically, January thru March is the best time of the school year for growth in student learning. Let's all work together to make this a reality for all BCCS students this year.

As noted in our last update, uninterrupted and consistent academic learning time is a high priority of our school. Bottom line, disruptions in the school's programs and services are impactful to student learning. As a school community, we all need to do whatever possible to ensure regular, consistent and on time school attendance.

With the recent series of snow days, there have been questions and interest with how this impacts the annual state required school days and hours. It is important to understand that given the unique characteristics of *our small but mighty school*, unlike most schools BCCS is responsible for multiple calendars/schedules for days and hours. Specifically, there are three schedules/groups that we have to report (and meet) the days and hours of attendance to the State of Michigan: Elementary, Mid-High, and the days and hours for HS students attending KCTC or KCT programs through KISD.

With that in mind, Michigan requires a minimum of 180 days and 1098 hours of school annually. The state allows up to 6 days or the equivalent number of hours for which pupil instruction is not provided due to circumstances not with-in the control of school authorities. Thus far, we have used 5 days and had one delay of two hours this school year. Please note, the 2 hr delay did not impact BCCS (RE: did not impact the number of days KCTC HS students were able to attend, and we have more than 1098 hours in our Elementary and Mid-High schedules).

Moving forward, BCCS has 1 more day of forgiveness time available. However, schools can apply to the State Superintendent for up to 3 additional days for forgiveness due to extenuating circumstances. More than you want to know perhaps, and So What??? Well, at this time we do not have to consider adding hours or days to the current school calendar to meet the required days and hours instruction. Please know, timely information will be provided to parents/guardians if and when we have to apply to the State Superintendent for additional days (up to 3), the subsequent response that may include a plan to address any additional days and hours we are required to make-up, if needed.

Just a reminder that our school primarily uses WoodTV 8 for media communications regarding school closures and delays. The preferred method is to use the REMIND app as a text will be sent directly to your phone of choice by the school (need info?... contact Mrs. Boersma). Please contact the school office if you have questions or support is needed.

As alway your awareness and consideration is appreciated.

News From the Office

<u>Grant Updates:</u> Additional one-time grant money has been offered to Michigan schools for a variety of purposes. Our school applied and is the recipient of multiple grants. Some of the benefits of these grants include:

- Additional Literacy Services: Funding is being used for additional services in literacy development for designated K-5 students Specifically, students are receiving individualized explicit phonics and phonemic awareness instruction by Ms. Young, MS ELA Teacher.
- Additional Math Supports: Grant funding enables BCCS to add extra math tutoring to mid-high students. Mathematics software XTRA-MATH has been added to help 1-7th grade students build their automaticity with basic math facts. Designated students in grades 5th-8th will have the opportunity to attend a summer math program designed to help grow the specific skills needed to successfully transition to the next grade and HS Algebra.
- Safety and Wellness Services: BCCS is adding social work services to designated students
 while funding the services of the school Wellness Officer, Mr. Devries. These services are
 intended to improve school safety for everyone while supporting the social emotional welfare of
 the students.

<u>BCCS Opportunity for Graduating Seniors:</u> Each year BCCS offers seniors an opportunity to be exempt from taking final exams in their last semester. Seniors can earn an exam exemption if...

- They maintain a class average of 83%/B for Semester 2.
 - Does not apply to online or dual enrollment courses.
- Have no more than 5 absences total for second semester, with no more than 3 absences during 4th quarter.
 - o Exemptions are determined on a case-by-case basis.
- Have no suspensions, or major discipline issues.
