Dear Parents Guardians of BCCS K-12 Students,

Back in the swing of things and moving along quickly..... Happy Spring everyone! The theme for the next month and a half is testing. All students will be administered state, national and in-house tests intended to measure a students growth and proficiency, and as a metric to measure school effectiveness. We should be reminded that the scores are a point in time, and a better reflection of a student's academic performance using multiple measures (state, national tests, daily performance and in-house tests) and looking at trend data, or performance over time. It is important that we all encourage students to give a good faith effort so that the results of the tests accurately reflect the student's ability. As parents/guardians, we call upon you to understand the importance of the annual state and national testing, to be aware of the test dates and to actively help prepare and encourage your children to give their best effort.

Positive Character Traits

The character traits are considered to be our school's shared values. They are celebrated each month, and they are intended to help guide our actions within and outside the school community. Whether it be your child, another student, a staff member, or a fellow parent/guardian, let's look for opportunities to recognize and affirm these traits in action.

The April BCCS character traits highlight FAIRNESS and COURAGE. Fairness means *impartial and just treatment or behavior without favoritism or discrimination*. An act of fairness combines honesty with equity, and often a little *courage* is needed. Courage is a person's ability to do the right thing especially when they know it is not going to be easy. Most of us view courage in the physical sense like bravery in battle. However, other types of courage that play a huge role in schools include social courage, intellectual courage and moral courage. From a student's viewpoint, fairness is often having the courage to do what is right.....not always the easiest road for sure! As members of our small, but mighty school community, we are called to look for and recognize acts of fairness and courage in our students.

State and National Testing

- Students are on time for school (especially PSAT and SAT testers/late students are not permitted to test)

- Students have breakfast (please have all students here no later than 7:45 if they are eating breakfast at school)
- Parental awareness and interest /dialogue with students about testing (i.e. good faith effort, encourage perseverance and inquire about the test...level of difficulty, their perceived performance etc...)
