#### BCCS Stakeholder Surveys

Each year BCCS administers school culture and climate surveys to all stakeholders (parents/guardians,students,and Teachers/Staff). These annual surveys provide valuable opinion/perceptual data from our stakeholders for school improvement purposes.

The 2023-24 surveys are being updated and a link will be sent out to BCCS parents/guardians in the next week. Students and staff will be administered the surveys during the school day. Each BCCS family is asked to complete at least one Culture and Climate Survey.

#### Summer School/Programs and Services

At this time BCCS has determined the 2024 Summer School Options. The information below provides grade-span/levels, whether in-house or in-home, if the program is offered to recommended students or an option for consideration, date ranges/time frames and the date parents can expect to receive the information.

The summer programs offered by BCCS include:

- 1. An in-house K-3 Extended Year/ Early Start Program for recommended K-3 Students
  - a. 2 week sessions in June and August
  - b. 4 days per week (Monday-Thursday)/ Total 16 days
  - c. 9-11:30/2.5 hrs per day
  - d. Information release May 10
- 2. An in-home, self-paced **4-5** Reading and/or Math program for <u>recommended</u> 4th and 5th grade students (Using the GRASP/Grand Rapids Summer Academic Program Booklets)
  - a. 100 %Grant supported/no cost to parents
  - b. Information release May 17
- 3. An in-house Middle School (**grades 6-8**) Math Program for <u>recommended</u> 6th-8th grade students
  - a. 2 week session
  - b. 4 days per week (Monday-Thursday)Total 8 Days
  - c. 9-11:30
    - \*\*\* two options offered June and August\*\*\*
  - d. Information Release May 10
- An in-home, self-paced Middle School (grades 6-8) Reading program for recommended 6th -8th grade grade students (Using the GRASP/Grand Rapids Summer Academic Program Booklets)
  - a. 100 %Grant supported/no cost to parents
  - b. Information release May 17
- 5. A **K-8** *Optional* in- home, self-paced Math and/or Reading program for any K-8 student (Using the GRASP/Grand Rapids Summer Academic Program Booklets)
  - a. Partial grant supported/ cost \$10 per booklet
  - b. Information release May 20
- 6. A HS Credit Recovery Program for <u>recommended</u> 9-11 Students through MySchool@Kent blended program (inline and face to face)
  - a. Course and instructors through Kent ISD
  - b. Courses begin in June and run through 2nd week in August
  - c. Information release by the end-of-year or as soon as made aware

As noted, specific information will be shared directly to the appropriate parents of students in the next two weeks.

- The parents of all students *recommended* for summer programing will receive information specific to the program(s) being recommended for their children
- The parents of all other K-8 students (not recommended) will receive information specific to the **optional** program, meaning parents may request participation.
